Attached is a report from **Michael Austin**, Sydney Cove Rotary Club, directly relating to the building of this facility, and he has covered this very well

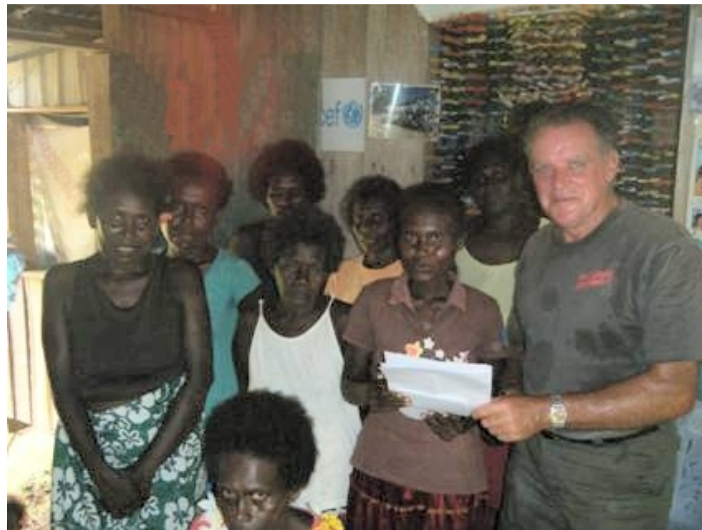
A **Financial Report** on this project, is available for the information of all Clubs and Team Members who were instrumental in raising the money to make this project possible.
